A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2023, Langley Animal In Protection Society faced challenges numerous amid soaring demand for our services. Economic challenges were felt by pet owners, LAPS, and the community. This post COVID world made a significant shift in the welfare need of dogs and cats. Dog intake surged, yet low claim rates and diminished adoption interest their prolonged stay, constraining our capacity to accept surrenders.

Demand for our food bank and spay/neuter voucher program surged, reflecting the economic strain within the community. Much needed monetary donations dwindled which strained our resources.

Nevertheless, despite these incredible challenges, LAPS provided refuge for a total of 828 animals, marking a 14.6% increase from the previous year.

In 2023 our adoption rate saw a notable increase by 23.07%. Among these animals a total of 27, comprising of 16 dogs and 11 cats, were rescued from a solitary residence where they were suffering from severe neglect and poor health. Thanks to the dedicated care of our veterinarians, volunteers, and staff, they received the intensive support necessary for a healthier future. We did all of work thanks to generosity of many through We legacy gifts. strengthened partnerships with key organizations enhanced our outreach, ensuring our services reached those in need.

Additional staffing enabled extended care hours, benefiting both the animals and staff by reducing These burnout. achievements underscore our resilience as an organization our unwavering and commitment to our mission. As we forge ahead, let's draw strength from these triumphs to continue making a meaningful impact. 



SAVING LIVES

WE PRIORITIZE CARE AND SAVE LIVES: HFRF'S HOW

We are deeply dedicated to ensuring that every animal that comes to our shelter receives the utmost care and attention. To that end, we have made a significant investment in medical treatments to address any health issues our animals may face. Despite the obstacles we have encountered, we firmly believe that every animal deserves a safe and caring home. It brings us great joy to know that we have been able to make a positive impact on their lives. In 2023, we saw a 14% increase in the number of animals that came through the shelter, including 362 cats, 445 dogs, 1 bird, and 20 other animals, which primarily consisted of farm animals. This surge in numbers highlights the growing need for our services and reinforces our commitment to providing a haven for diverse animals in search of refuge and care.

THRIVING ANIMALS, CARING PEOPLE.



During 2023, LAPS faced a critical shortage of animal control officer (ACO) vehicles. Due to the expansion of the team they were short a vehicle and another was lost in an unfortunate accident.

However, just when the situation seemed dire, a ray of hope emerged in the form of a generous donor. In honour of their own furry companions, Lexi and Rylie Jackman, this benefactor stepped forward and donated two brand new trucks to LAPS.

These vehicles weren't just replacements; they were symbols of compassion and support. With these additions, the ACO team was equipped to patrol parks, reunite lost pets with their families, and ensure the safety and well-being of animals in the community. Thanks to the kindness of Lexi and Rylie's angels, Langley guardian Animal Protection Society could continue our crucial work with renewed efficiency and dedication.

ANSWERING THE CALL: OUR COMMUNITY SERVICE EFFORTS

In 2023, we answered the call to serve with 2,221 community calls, patrolling parks for 385 hours, and reuniting 408 lost pets with their families. These efforts represent our unwavering commitment to the well-being of both animals and people in our community.

Making a difference in our community is at our core. We believe that by being proactive, we can make a lasting impact that benefits everyone, and we are proud to see the results of our hard work. As we move forward, we remain dedicated to our mission of creating a better world for all beings, and we look forward to continuing to make a difference in our community.









FINDING FOREVER HOMES: OUR ADOPTION SUCCESS

In 2023, our adoption program thrived, achieving notable success with 99 dogs, 249 cats, 1 peafowl, 2 chickens, and 1 bird finding loving homes. This marks a significant increase from 2022, particularly in cat adoptions. We continued to prioritize responsible pet ownership by licensing 1,261 dogs, enhancing the chances of reuniting lost pets with their families. These accomplishments underscore the dedication of our staff and volunteers, coupled with the ongoing support from our community. As we celebrate, we remain committed to fostering a responsible and compassionate community that understands the commitments associated with pet adoption.

GENEROSITY IN ACTION: COMMUNITY DONATIONS

In 2023, our community's extraordinary generosity continued to make a significant impact on the lives of families and animals in need, furthering our commitment to compassionate care. Through the invaluable support of Major's Legacy fund and our pet food bank, we extended crucial assistance to those facing economic challenges. Major's Legacy fund played a pivotal role, providing \$33,874 in financial aid to 39 low income families and 46 animals. This support was distributed strategically, with dental. \$2,438.26 \$6,572.69 allocated to for euthanasia/cremation, \$2,158.89 for spays/neuters, \$21,460.07 for emergency exams/lab tests/X-rays/wound repairs, and \$1,244.09 for exams, deworming, and vaccination. Additionally, our pet food bank saw a remarkable increase with 6,891.53 pounds of food donated, benefiting 93 low income families and including the distribution of 257 spay/neuter vouchers. The impact of these efforts goes beyond numbers, symbolizing the compassionate spirit of our community, without which none of this vital assistance would have been possible. We express our profound gratitude for the ongoing generosity that enables us to make a meaningful difference in the lives of those we serve.

THANK YOU PARA SPACE

In 2023, Para Space Landscaping extended a heartfelt gesture to LAPS, offering their time and resources for a transformative "day of service." Their initiative was nothing short of remarkable, focusing on revitalizing our front yard dog play area, which had fallen into disrepair.

Before Para Space intervened, the space was overgrown by saplings, making it unusable for its intended purpose. Muddiness prevailed, with no defined pathways, and the area lacked seating. Recognizing the potential for improvement, Para Space committed to breathe new life into this essential part of our facility.

With the dedication of 36 volunteers, Para Space embarked on a two-phase project that would completely overhaul the dog play area. Phase one involved the meticulous clearance of brush, paving the way for a fresh start, and laying down bark mulch to establish clear pathways. Moreover, they undertook the ambitious task of preparing space for a pergola, envisioning a shaded retreat for both humans and animals alike. Additionally, privacy hedges were strategically planted, serving as a buffer against the noise from the adjacent highway.









Phase witnessed the two transformation reaching its pinnacle, as Para Space added vital amenities to enhance the play area's functionality and appeal. A sandbox emerged, offering our animals an outlet for enrichment. Agility items, including a bridge, were thoughtfully integrated, enhancing the space with opportunities for physical activity and mental stimulation Benches were installed, providing much-needed seating for visitors and staff to relax and engage with the animals.

The impact of Para Space's efforts echoes throughout our organization, as the revitalized play area now serves a multitude of purposes. Including a welcome space for potential adopters to interact with our furry residents during meet and greets, fostering meaningful connections. Moreover, it functions as a hub for dog enrichment activities, promoting their physical and mental well-being.

Staff members find solace in the tranquil surroundings during lunch breaks, while the area doubles as a versatile meeting space. Most importantly, it serves as a haven for the dogs, offering a destress area where they can unwind and recharge amidst the hustle and bustle of shelter life.

Para Space's commitment to our cause exemplifies the power of community collaboration and underscores the profound difference that can be made through collective action. Their generosity has not only transformed a physical space but has also uplifted spirits and enriched lives —both human and animal alike. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Para Space and its volunteers for their unwavering support and dedication to our mission. 


